Video image file types

Our displays are configured to play 1080p (HD) video. The maximum video file size is 2GB however we are able to display several video files sequentially without any visual disruption.

Supported codecs 4K: H265

Supported Extensions 4K: .ts, .mov, .mp4, .mkv, .webm (Please note, only a limited number of displays at Tūranga are capable of displaying 4K resolution video).

Check the license restrictions. We can display appropriately credited content with a Creative Commons license. For content with other license types we'll need the written permission from the copyright holder.

Title Breaks

All presentations will need a title slide with the name of the exhibition and the owner/producer. Include this at regular intervals throughout the presentation.

Screen Burn-In

Screen burn-in occurs when the same images or colours are displayed for long periods of time which damages the display units. To prevent this make sure your presentation is visually diverse. Add in a few full frame images or different coloured title breaks.

Text

Generally text information should be understood by the viewer within 2-3 seconds so try to keep it concise. It helps to allow enough time between slides for average readers to read the text twice. If your presentation needs lots of text, consider related web content, printed material or splitting it across several slides.
